Advancement opportunities, exciting weekend camping trips, and a quality summer camp experience keep youth involved, engaged, and motivated to continue to benefit from all Scouting has to offer.

If you're not aware, these programs also help our Council to qualify for a very generous challenge grant on an annual basis, the "Lange Challenge". This multi-year program honors the memory of Alexander 'Skip' Lange and his belief that an active Scout is likely to stay in Scouting and earn their Eagle Scout award. In order to again qualify for the grant, we need your help.

- 1) Please fill out the form attached to this letter, reflecting the camping experiences you have conducted this year, as well as those your PLC anticipates conducting between now and December 31st. In order to qualify for this grant, we need to identify that at least 65% of our Troops are participating in 8 or more short term weekend experiences throughout the course of the year. These forms can be scanned and emailed to camping@crossroadsbsa.org, or just simply write a brief email with the same information.
- 2) On the attached page, you will see a list of youth who-according to our records- have not received a rank advancement in 2019 as of the end of August. We know that our records aren't always accurate, as Scouts are always advancing. Would you please review this page and submit any changes to advancement@crossroadsbsa.org. Please continue to submit advancements as normal, but if you see an error, let us know by October 30th so that we can ensure our records are updated before year-end.
- 3) Both camping and advancement are leading indicators of a Troop's success, as outlined in the Journey to Excellence. We have also included the Journey to Excellence Troop Scorecard for 2019 in this mailing. Please take time to review with your committee and PLC to ensure that the other important indicators are reflected in your troop calendar. Remember, please turn in a copy of this Scorecard with your recharter paperwork.

Thank you so much for your dedication to Scouting, and your partnership in helping us once again achieve the "Lange Challenge". Funds secured through this program are directly reinvested to benefit Scouts and families in the Crossroads of America Council.
